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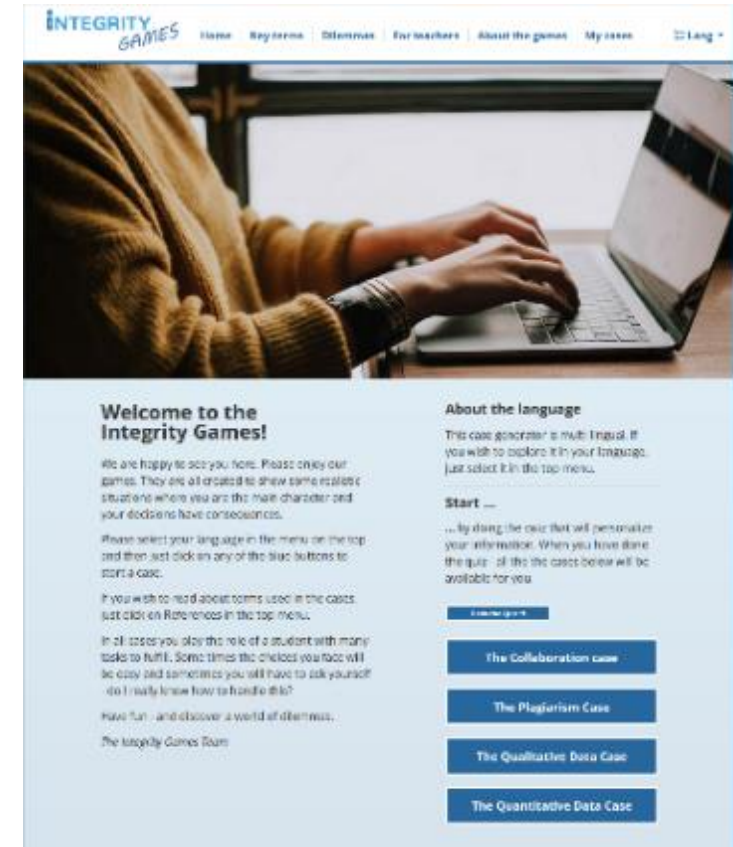

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
Integrity Games

A brief tour

How to use Integrity Games in teaching?

- The tool is intentionally flexible.

We have used it in a variety of classes as:

- 1. Preparation:** Students are assigned one or two cases to explore prior to a session on academic integrity.
 - a) You even let the quiz assign cases for you!
- 2. An individual assignment within a session:** Students are asked to explore a case individually
 - a) Followed either by plenum or group discussion.
 - b) End page can be used to guide plenum discussion .

It could also be used as:

- 3. A group assignment within a session.**
- 4. Individual dilemmas could also be assigned as a small exercise in class.**

Is it fun?

- To what extent do you agree with the following statements?
 - (1-5 with 5 being complete agreement)
- “Playing Integrity Games was fun”: 4,0
- “I would recommend 'Integrity Games' to teachers preparing classes on academic integrity for undergraduate students: 4,1

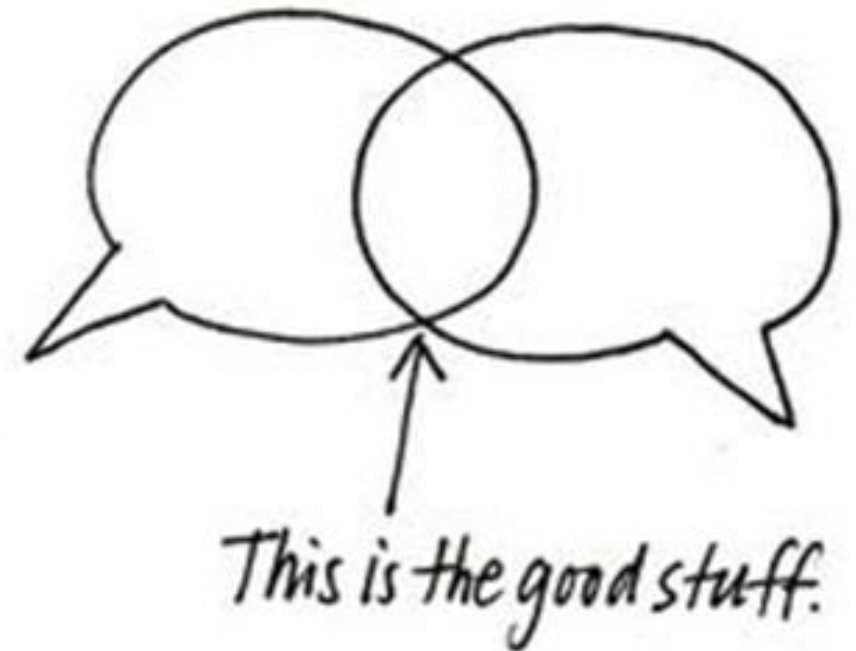


Does it work?

- **We have tested Integrity Games in a series of randomized controlled experiments.**
 - **N=272 students from three countries representing all major faculties.**
- **Effect of playing the games was tested in a standard pre-test post-test.**
 - **Significant positive effect.**
- **AND compared to the effect of reading a non-gamified text on the same topics.**
 - **No significant difference!**
